Jenny Lussier – Shared comments regarding "unjust" termination of Mr. Eric VerHey as a substitute teacher. Wonders if due process was properly followed during this matter. Concern regarding the impact on students, especially the 6^{th} graders.

Eric VerHey – Shared experiences with his background culminating with his time served at Athens Area Schools. Served as Academic Intervention Room staff member and then later as a substitute 6^{th} grade teacher, as well as a coach.

Cliff Denney (gave 3 minutes of time to Eric VerHey) — Continued to discuss his time at Athens. Shared details around the incident that led to his termination. Noted that he was under the impression that the matter had been handled with the meeting with the building principal and his colleague.

Melissa Irons (gave 3 minutes of time to *Eric VerHey*) – Asks the Board of Education to reconsider his termination and to be reinstated as a substitute teacher.

Shannon Tuttle – Read statements from other parents who couldn't make tonight's regular meeting, due to an athletic conflict. Letters continued to express concern over the termination of Mr. Eric VerHey.

Nate Kiefer – *Asked a question regarding why the substitute teacher was terminated?*

Kacie Brunner – Read information from a FOIA request she completed with the District regarding the incident that resulted in Mr. Eric VerHey's termination. Shared that she was disturbed to hear that Mr. Eric VerHey had contacted students after the incident, with his personal phone number.

Nate Kiefer – Discussed process that his son went through regarding disciplinary actions and ensuring that it is a fair process for all.

Jessica Blanchard – Discussed perspective from her student's experience after Mr. Eric VerHey was terminated. Academically, seeing her student's grades impacted.

Michelle Kounelis – Retired Portage Schools teacher. Here to attest to Mr. Eric VerHey's character. Also spoke to the ongoing teacher shortage.

Terry Nixon – Believes that there should have been some type of progressive discipline followed in this incident. Concern regarding the timing of Mr. Eric VerHey's termination, as well. Concern over the lack of education being conducted during this transition period.

Haley Denney (gave 3 minutes of time to Cliff Denney) — We elected the Board of Education to do what's in the best interest for the students and our school. Wonders if a policy review is in order? Encourages the Board of Education to reconsider this process.

Sandy Paesans – Michigan Education Association (MEA) representative for Athens Area Schools. Discussed the difference between a professional staff member and an "at-will" employee. Mr. Eric VerHey was a substitute teacher for Athens.

Thomas Burke (gave 3 minutes of time to **Sandy Paesans**) – The question isn't "was it legal to terminate Mr. Eric VerHey?" but if "we should have terminated him?"

Rebecca Kinney (gave 3 minutes to **Eric VerHey**) – Shared that he did not text students, but instead reached out via email regarding his health, as students were scared that a health issue had resulted in his absence from school.

Kacie Brunner and Melissa Irons – Shared information about a new program through the Athens Community Library for Athens students. New eResources now available for Athens students. Shared handout with specific details for new resources.
